 - Co-chairs will be leading meetings and HCPFs role is keeping committee members abreast on where we are at, looking at Medicaid members between ages of 11-17 in year one; Child and youth eligible for EHFW, residing in or being discharged to a home-like or family setting, including foster care, kinship care, legal family/guardian in a home environment
 - Would family like setting include those still in the home but at risk?





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Department of Health Care Policy & Financing

- Not at this time.
- How are we addressing kids who cannot find placement for QRTP or PRTF or find a residential out of state?
 - Right now the BHA is meeting behavioral health needs of all its members, RAEs can make referrals for these services to have a placement prior to discharge.
- When we have families in current crisis in need of QRTP and PRTF treatment, how and what is the state's plan to support those families who need that respite support? Concern about children being adjudicated to youth detention facilities.
 - RAEs are responsible for meeting behavioral health needs of those children and youth. Part of CO-SOC is to reduce the length of stay, open up additional beds, but they are not eligible for CO-SOC at this time. They do still have access to behavioral health capitated benefits.
- Are we trying to prevent out of home placement? Workforce Capacity Center?
 - This is the ultimate goal of the six year rollout. We are trying to extend the workforce to implement services outlined in the Implementation Plan. QRTP and PRTF expansion is not being focused on through the Workforce Capacity Center.
- How and are you collecting data on the numbers of children that are planning to exit these facilities? Can we see data on a regular basis?
 - RAEs are already actively identifying children and youth and partnering with QRTPs and PRTFs to identify children and youth that meet this criteria. Collaborative approach to CO-SOC between RAEs and QRTPs.
- Who is collecting all of this information to send out to advisory committees? Can we plan for a regular cycle of data to come to our committee?
 - Currently HCPF is collecting info to send out to advisory committees. We can take this proposal back to the other advisory committee co-chairs so we can sync up. There are public reporting requirements to be mindful of as we kick this work off.
- Who is the target workforce for year one?
 - We are currently hosting potential provider forums for services rolling out in year one, our target is those providers coming into this space. Each RAE has a contact for CO-SOC.
